Introductions, Announcements & Thanks

Introductions were made and Nancy thanked everyone for attending.

The group discussed the sudden passing of Emilie Crown, MCFR and SKMC on February 6. Her memorial service will be on Saturday, February 11 at the Damascus Activities Building. Nancy proposed sending a donation from SKFC in Emilie's honor and memory. The group discussed this and suggested \$150.00. Members approved the motion made by Nancy and seconded by Roslyn.

Grant Reports

- Nancy is invited to attend the February 14 Kiwanis Club of Suburban Frederick meeting to report on SKFC and receive a check.

SKMD/SKW Updates

- Angel stated that Karen Hardingham from SK Baltimore participated in a SKW conference call discussing marijuana safety. Representatives from Washington and Colorado shared their experiences. More information will follow from SKW. Nancy stated she used to be on that mailing list, but it didn't transfer when Families Plus email account was shut down.

- A discussion began about who was on the MD Child Fatality Review Board. Their priority is ACEs (Adverse Childhood Experiences). Nancy sits at the local level meetings. Jan Sparks, FCHD leads both the FIMR and CFR committees in Frederick County.
- Cyndy stated SKW PrevCon will start July 17 and is in Baltimore this year. The conference is 3 days and there will be a pre-conference coordinator meeting and a new coordinator orientation. Hopefully, the new SKFC Coordinator will be on board and able to attend the entire conference. Boy George from the Celebrity Apprentice is to be a guest.
- Cyndy stated SKD grant letters came out from Dan this week and will be similar to last year's awards. Nancy stated that due to the interruption in SKFC sponsorship that we were not able to participate in any grants.

Program Reports

- **Heatstroke Campaign** – Nancy reported: 0 deaths 2017
- **Child Passenger Safety** – Nancy reported:
 - Individual appointments (3)
 - Distributed: 1 infant, 1 convertible
 - Emilie's untimely death caused a CPST training 2/10-12 to be cancelled. Miriam and 4 other Maternal-Child Health staff, 2 WIC staff and Maggie Rauser's intern were enrolled. Troy has received permission to allow them into the academy classes. They will be split among the 3 upcoming classes.
- **Fire Prevention** – Judy reported:
 - Fire Prevention Week is October 8-14, 2017.
 - MFRI Mt. Airy headquarters is being renovated and having sprinkler systems retrofitted.
 - Angel announced that her daughter's HC high school had an early AM fire in a boys restroom, the sprinklers and alarm sounded and 800 students exited the school in 4 minutes. No one was injured.
 - Cyndy announced March 25 is the Public Safety Conference.
 - Mary Marchone is bringing new curriculum.
 - Cyndy announced Partnership for a Safer MD Summit is June 8 in Annapolis.
- **Poison Prevention** – Angel reported:
 - Thank you to Christie Bussard...Angel presented a 3-hour lecture to 9 Hood nursing students for part of their pediatric unit in place of Martha Gurzick, FMH Faculty Advisor
 - MD Poison Center's social media position has been filled and the person will start February 20. Her previous position was as the Public Educator at the Washington Poison Center in Seattle. She will be a great addition to the MPC.
 - 2016 stats are being processed.

- Harford CHD had Angel on a Health Matters segment, scheduled to tape February 17 on pediatric safety with a local pediatrician who highlighted Safe Sleep. The segment will air in March or April.
- CA treatment centers have requested posters due to children accessing Oxycodone and Marijuana.
- Poison Prevention Week is March 19-.25, 2017. Angel has had responses from the following counties: Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Carroll, Cecil, St. Mary's, Washington, Wicomico. She has not received a response from Frederick. Nancy will follow-up.
- **Safe Routes to School** – Shayne sent a report:
 - The Frederick Bicycle Coalition will have a Bike to School event with Hillcrest ES on May 26.
 - Waverly ES is also interested in having an event around the same time.
 - Lincoln ES will not participate this year due to the school counselor being out on maternity leave and the community liaison retiring.
 - The FBC will also participate with Planting Hope this year and would like SKFC to be a partner with all of these events.
 - Nancy stated we have bicycle helmets at Logistics.
