INTRODUCTIONS/ MINUTES/ STRATEGIC PLAN

DISCUSSION	Meeting minutes from 03/2017 approved. Introduction of K. Stinchcomb (UMD School of Pharmacy) for guidance and advisement over Strategic Plan for FY2017-2018. Focus remains on low perceived risk of prescription opioids and lack of awareness in the community about safe storage and disposal. REVISIONS include-focus on promotion of current permanent drop off location and semi-annual drug take back events. Permanent drop boxes must have monitored law enforcement presence. New prevention webpage "Stay in the Know" to better engage public will cover all areas of prevention. For opioid education and references (download/print available) www.stayintheknow/opioids . Pharmacy Targeted Messaging and DUAL Provider Targeted Messaging and Education. FMH discharge papers will include prescription drop box locations as of July 1, 2017.	
CONCLUSIONS	Continue community partnerships for promotion, and look at the media sources available for further education to the community regarding disposal. Enhance the "Take Back My Life" website + new prevention webpage "Stay in the Know" to include permanent drop off locations. Review, field test, and update messages and their relatability to target audience. FPD program currently suspended-C. Terl to follow up. Implement formal reporting from LE partners, minimum 2x/year, on collection at permanent drop off locations. Any additional suggestions or comments on strategic plan can be emailed to Dr. Parker.

OMPP UPDATES/DISCUSSION

DISCUSSION	OMPP focus on age group 18 and older (adults). Part of the reason for this focus is from data collection of the County overdose data provided by law enforcement (Analyst from FCSO) FMH currently not reporting data of non-fatal overdoses. Frederick's OD numbers stand at 195 non-fatal and 27 fatal for 2017. Frederick County Sheriff's Office received first confirmed "Pink" or synthetic opioid u-47700 seizure. OD Mapping concept as a tool for first responders to get real time OD info for county. Lack of educational piece. Frederick County Public Schools starting to show interest in coming to the table to discuss ideas. Importance of including Provider/Prescriber targeted messaging as part of the strategic plan.
