The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) States that globally, an estimate of 36.7 million persons are living with HIV/AIDS. Each year more than 1 million people die from AIDS-related causes and 2.1 million become newly infected by HIV. Two-thirds of new HIV infections worldwide occur in sub-Saharan Africa. In the United States, 1.1 million people are living with HIV, and 1 in 7 people don't know they are infected with HIV.

Maryland Department of Health records 1,118 adult/adolescent HIV cases (age 13+) diagnosed in Maryland in 2016. And at the end 2016, 30,430 adults/adolescents were living with HIV in Maryland. Maryland was ranked 5th among U.S. states in adult/adolescent HIV diagnosis rates (per 100,000) and 3rd in AIDS diagnosis rates (per 100,000) in 2015.

The CDC recommends everyone between the ages of 13 and 64 get tested at least once for HIV, and that some people should get tested more often. For more information on the World AIDS Day event and/or for HIV testing call Ken Melnick at 301-600-3388. The Frederick County Health Department offers the following STD-related services:

- Free rapid HIV testing, results in as little as 10 minutes
- Free treatment for syphilis, as needed
- Free STI screening for age 20 years and younger
- Partner notification for HIV, syphilis, gonorrhea, and chlamydia
 - Our Disease Intervention Specialist can assist with locating and informing partners at risk for STD's.
- HIV treatment and case management
- HIV support groups
