1. Introductions

- a. Jay Hessler convened the meeting and introductions of meeting attendees occurred.

2. Review/Approval of Minutes

- a. Minutes were reviewed and no corrections were noted.

3. Announcements

- a. Andrea Walker presented data collected by the Mental Health Association regarding their walk-in center services.
- b. Andrea Walker shared information about some of the work being done by the Mental Health Local Health Improvement Process Workgroup. “From

the Heart” is a transformative arts project designed to reduce stigma surrounding mental health in an inclusive way. The most recent event is “Voices of Color” on 2/16/24.

- c. Pilar Olivo (lead of the ACEs Workgroup from LHIP) presented data analysis from the most recent Youth Risk Behavior Survey, highlighting the intersection with suicide prevention.

4. FCC Request (Emily Gebhart)

- a. Emily Gebhart provided information to the coalition about FCC’s “Courageous Conversations” program. Emily is seeking volunteers that would be willing to talk to FCC students about suicide. Courageous Conversations encourages open, honest discussions about topics that can be polarizing in a setting devoid of judgement.

6. Subcommittee Report Out

- a. *Responsible Gun Ownership*: Focused efforts on identifying locations to drop-off pamphlets about SP for gun owners strategically. Subcommittee members will divide and deliver them to firearm vendors. The subcommittee is gathering information about safe storage facilities. Dr. Richard Sedlak is researching the master drivers (policy / procedure) for establishing a safe storage facility.
- a. *Education/Outreach*: The subcommittee discussed an FCC panel that Jamel Freeman is having. The subcommittee spoke more about using YRBS data to highlight the need for youth to talk to peers about MH and suicide. Their thinking is that youth are more likely to go to each other, but that youth may feel unprepared with what to say to each other. Question posed about what FCPS does for suicide prevention education for students. Amy Coldren reported that FCC offers MH First Aid for free for their students.
- b. *Postvention / Outreach*: no members of the subcommittee were available to report out.
- c. *Veterans*: The survey about Asking the Question was sent out twice, but this yielded only 11 responses. The subcommittee is trying to get a larger number of providers to send the survey out to with a goal of enhancing the number of responses.

7. Announcements from BHA Office of Suicide Prevention

Ramiyah Barbour discussed the upcoming event “Taking Care of Us:” A celebration of Black Trailblazers in Mental Health. The discussion will highlight how Black Americans have been leaders, visionaries, and influencers in the mental health field.
