Plan ahead (these clinics happen every other week):

- [Next clinic in Thurmont](#) will be August 21 at the Municipal Building parking lot, 615 E. Main Street, 5pm-7pm.
- [Next clinic in Emmitsburg](#) will be August 25 at the Seton Center, 226 Lincoln Ave, 12pm-2pm.

Face coverings and physical distancing are required, but no documentation, insurance, or doctor's order is needed. Testing is FREE and you don't have to be sick to be tested. These clinics use diagnostic (not antibody) tests. Registration is not required so that the walk-up clinics remain as accessible as possible. Spanish interpreters are on-site. Frederick Health Hospital curbside testing also does not have registration requirements, but a vehicle is required.

Utility Assistance Program Now Accepting Applications

Beginning August 3, 2020, The Frederick Community Action Agency's Office of Home Energy Programs (OHEP) began administering Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) CARES funding to assist Frederick City residents with utility emergencies due to COVID-19. Update on Wastewater Testing for COVID-19

Frederick County Government is taking an innovative approach to help public health officials assess the severity of the community's COVID-19 outbreak. Any infected person, whether or not they are experiencing symptoms, sheds the virus. So Frederick County is testing untreated wastewater at its largest plant to gain insights on how widespread the virus is.

This short video provides some background on this new process.



Maryland Insurance Administration:

The Maryland Health Benefit Exchange has reopened the coronavirus emergency special enrollment period until December 15. Maryland Health Connection plans cover testing, visits relating to testing, and treatment of COVID-19. Consumers will not be billed for a copay, coinsurance, or deductible for services to test, diagnose, and treat COVID-19. Marylanders do not need to be sick to enroll in coverage. This special enrollment is for private health plans only. Those who qualify for Medicaid may enroll any time of year.

To enroll, visit MarylandHealthConnection.gov or download the free "Enroll MHC" mobile app. For free consumer assistance, call 855-642-8572 from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. on weekdays. Help is available in more than 200 languages through the call center, as well as Relay service for the Deaf and hard of hearing. Trained navigators and brokers statewide offer free help enrolling by phone.
