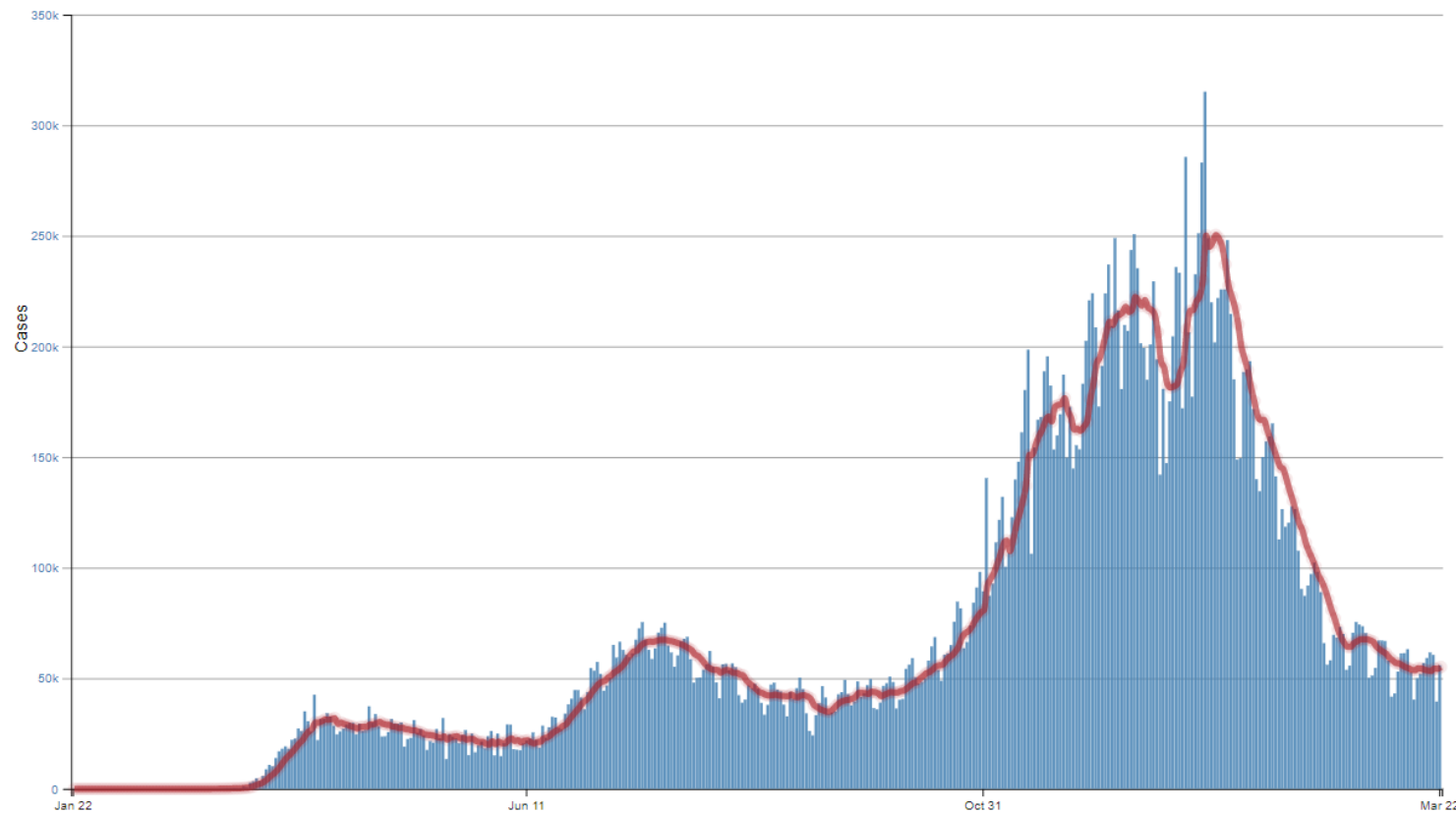

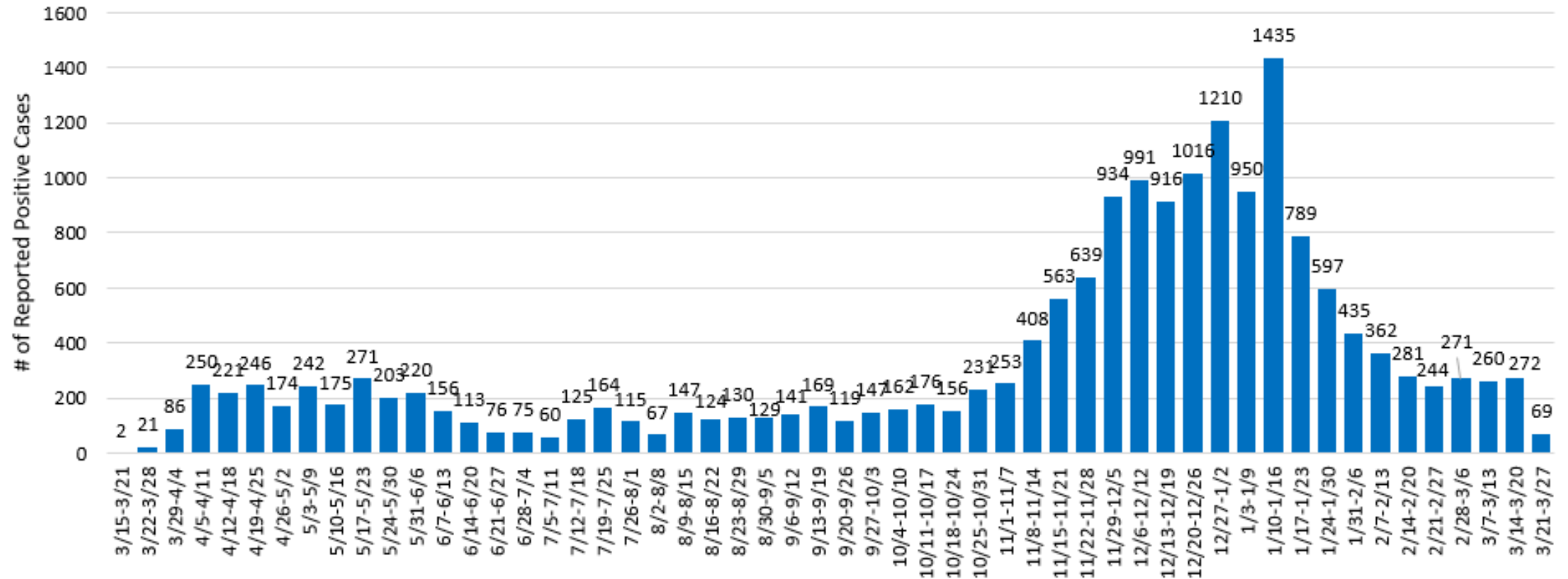

Frederick County MD COVID-19 Cases by Week

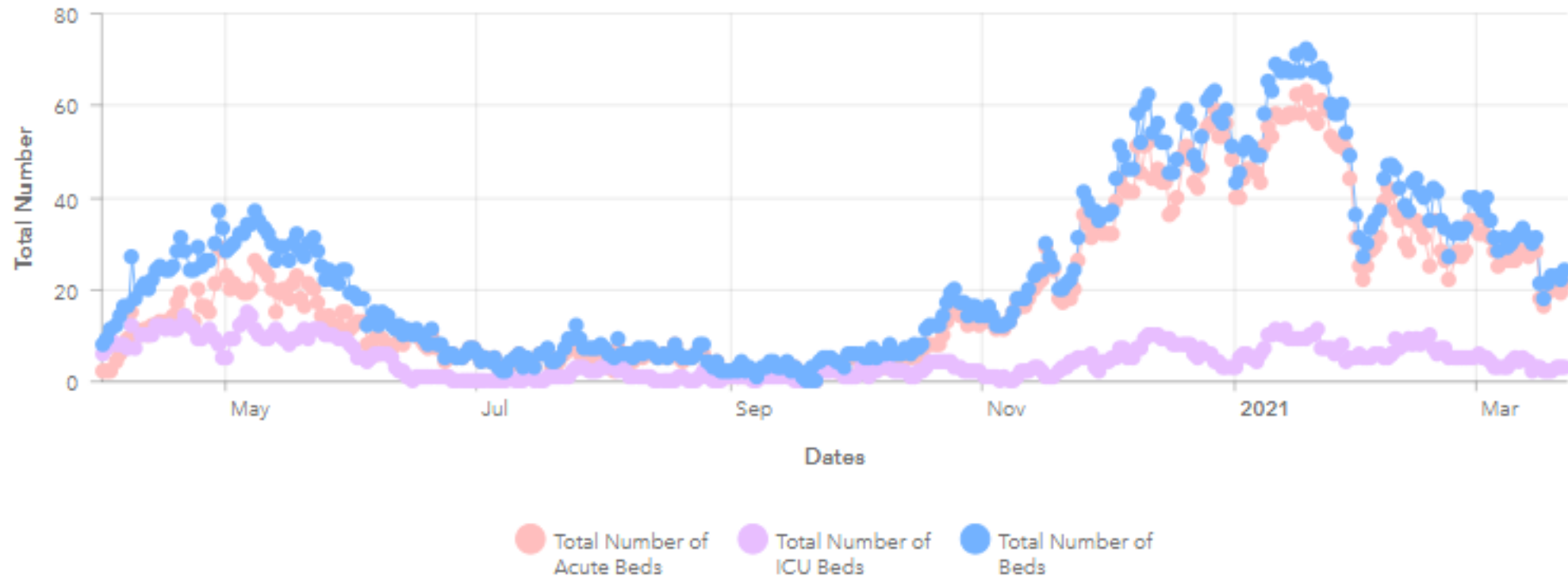

Frederick County Covid-19 Hospitalizations

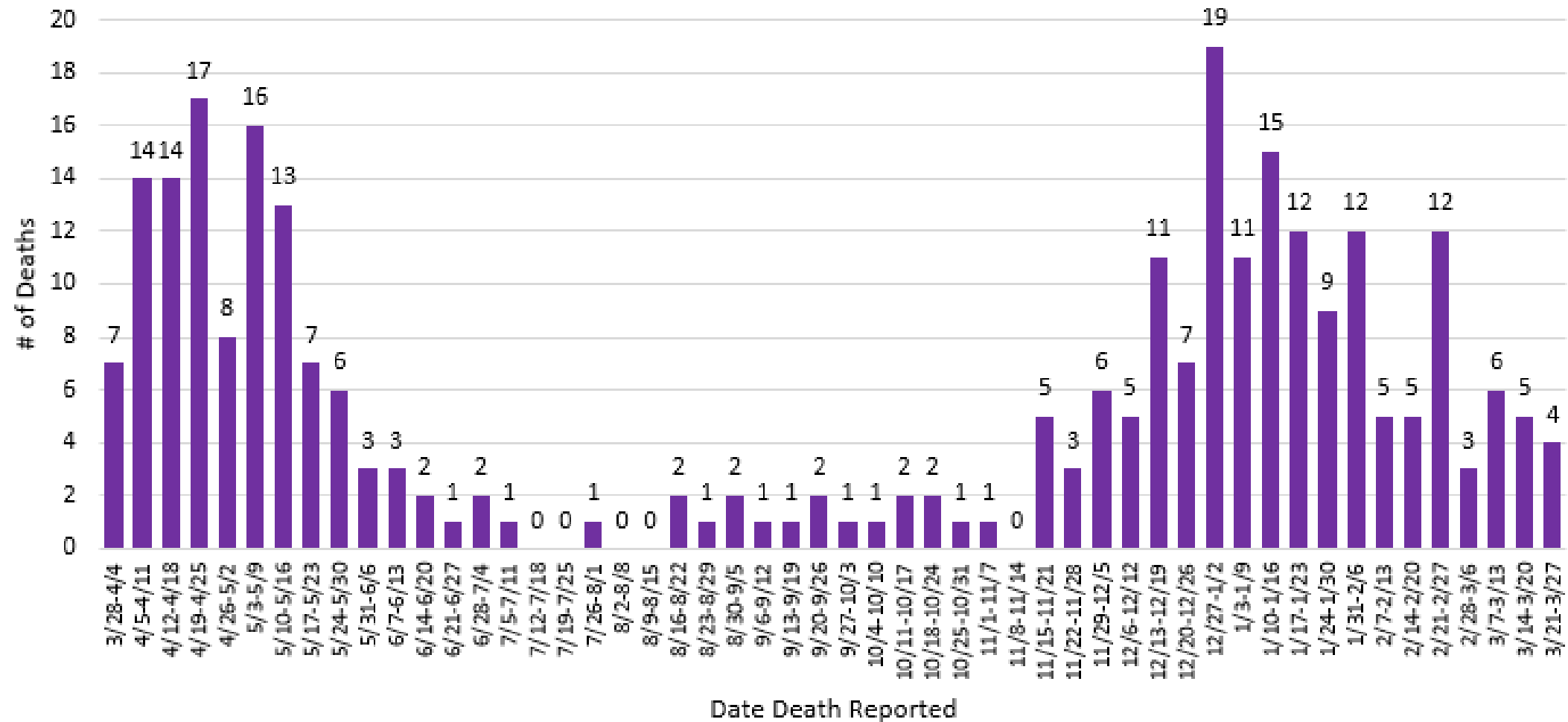

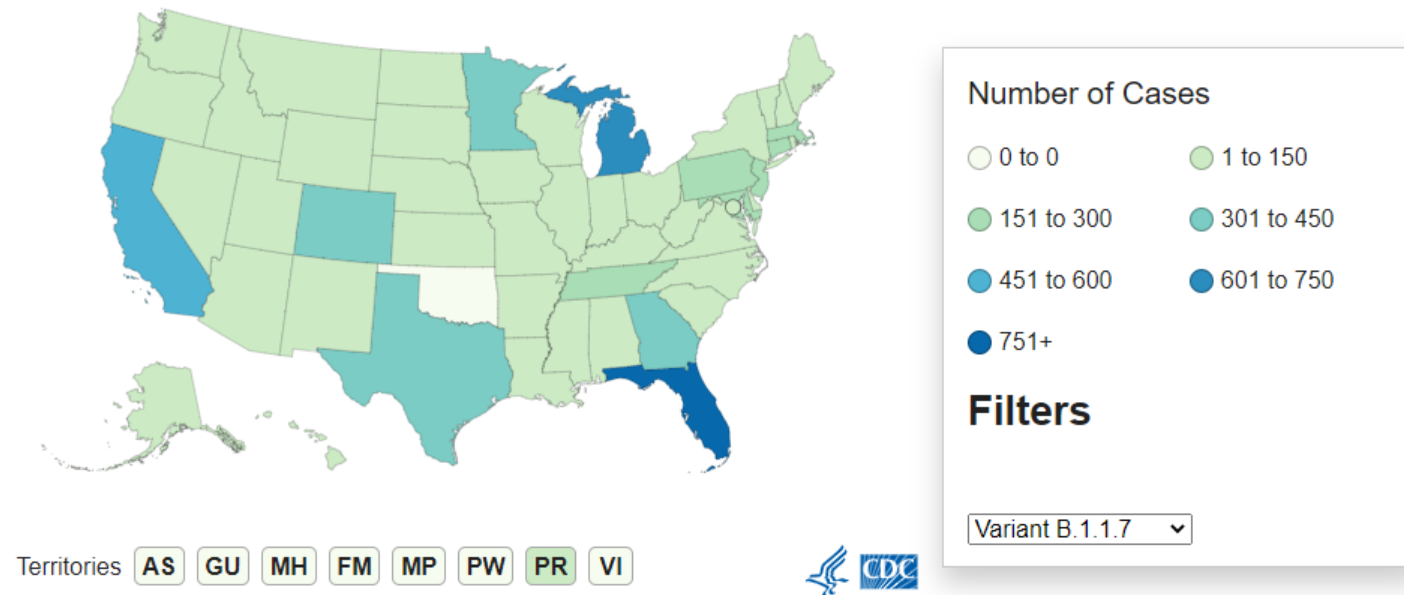

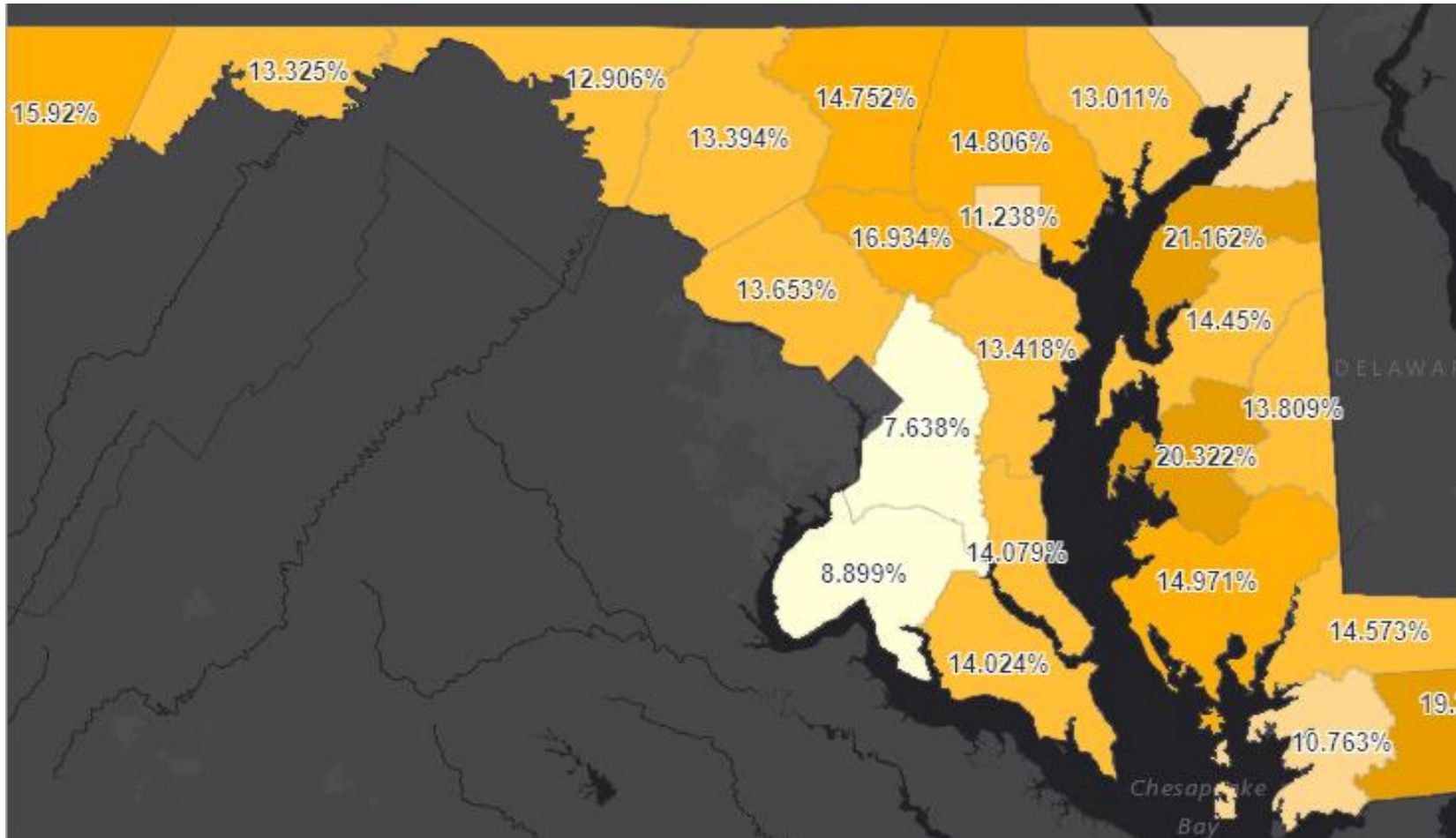

WHEN: March 30

2C

WHO: Marylanders age 55 and older, as well as essential workers in critical industries

WHEN: April 13

WHO: All Marylanders age 16 and older

WHEN: April 27

Currently in Place in Maryland

- Governor Hogan's Executive Order 21-03-09-01
 - *At 50% maximum occupancy:*
 - Convention and Banquet Facilities
 - Indoor Venues – any indoor venue at which live performances occur, motion pictures are shown, or sporting events occur (including, without limitation, major league, professional, minor league, semi-professional, amateur, recreational, motor sports and collegiate sporting events
 - Outdoor Venues – any outdoor venue in Maryland at which (i.) live performance occur, motion pictures are shown or sporting events occur (including, without limitation major league, professional, motor sports and collegiate sporting events), and (ii) entry is limited to ticketed customers. Does not include golf courses and driving ranges, drive-in movie theaters, outdoor swimming pools, outdoor day camps, amusement parks, tour boats, miniature gold establishment, and go-kart tracks.



Currently in Place in Maryland

- Governor Hogan's Executive Order 21-03-09-01
 - *Face coverings required for all persons in Maryland over 5 years*
 - Indoors in any public location
 - Outdoors and unable to consistently maintain 6 feet distance
 - Exceptions

Proposed Frederick County BoH Regulation 01-2021

- removes restrictions on social gatherings involving 25 or more persons
- adds a requirement for certain public gatherings of 100 or more persons to provide to the Health Department information about the gathering
- no longer places occupancy limits on fitness centers or wedding venues
- locations will still need to comply with the Governor's most recent Executive Order and applicable health directives

Proposed Frederick County BoH Regulation 01-2021

■ Recitals

- *The recitals are unchanged except for the last sentence, which notes the adoption of this proposed resolution.*

■ Section A- Face Coverings

- *This section remains largely the same and mirrors the Governor's Executive Order regarding face coverings, but is updated to reference the most recent Executive Order 21-03-09-01.*

Proposed Frederick County BoH Regulation 01-2021

■ Section B- Gatherings

- *B (1) identifies the social gatherings applicable in this section (emphasis on public gatherings) and the number of persons this section is applicable to is increased to 100 or more. This section requires a designated responsible person to ensure compliance with face coverings, physical distancing, occupancy limits, and other infection transmission mitigation actions.*
- *B (2) requires the organization holding a social gathering defined in (B)(1) to provide event information, including the date, name of responsible person, and contact information one week before the event is scheduled to occur.*
- *B (3) outlines which social gatherings this subsection does not apply to, including gatherings on personal private property which the public in general is not expected to attend.*
- *Prior B (3) and Prior B (4) have been deleted, but are still subject to any applicable State Executive Orders.*



Proposed Frederick County BoH Regulation 01-2021

- **Section C- Incorporation of State Executive Orders and MDH Directives and Orders**
 - *Section C has been updated to incorporate the newest version of the State Executive Order, as well as the MDH Directive and Order Regulating Certain Businesses and Facilities & General Directives Concerning Limiting the Spread of COVID-19, Number 2021-03-09-01.*

Proposed Frederick County BoH Regulation 01-2021

- **Section D- Compliance with this Regulation**
 - *Section D remains largely the same, but has been slightly reworded for clarity, and emphasis is placed on following the Maryland Department of Commerce's Back to Business Best Practices, which incorporates CDC recommendations.*
- **Sections E- Enforcement, Section F- Applicability, and Section G- Severability remain unchanged.**
- **Section H- Effective Date**
 - *This section has been updated to show the new effective date and time, as well as indicate that this proposed regulation will supersede Regulation BOH 02-2020.*

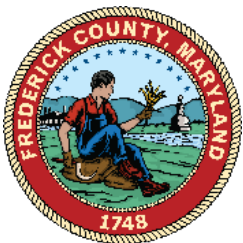
