# **Health Department:**

The Health Department is now reporting 653 positive cases of COVID-19 and 11 newly reported deaths which occurred over the last week, for a total of 40 deaths. # Tips on safe face covering handling:

How to Put the Face Covering On

- Wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds (or alcohol-based sanitizer).
- Dry your hands with a clean paper towel and throw the paper towel away.
- Make sure the exterior side of the face covering is facing out, away from your face.
- Place the face covering on your face with the exterior side facing out. If it has ties, use the ties and avoid touching the inside/outside of the covering
- Make sure the covering is completely secure. Make sure it covers your nose and mouth so that the bottom edge is under your chin.
- Wash your hands.

#### While Wearing During the Day

- Do NOT pull the covering down like one would a scarf
- Adjustments should be made using the ties

- Avoid touching your face even when the covering is in place.
- Every time you do touch the face covering for any reason, wash your hands before/after touching

#### Removing and Cleaning the Covering

- Wash your hands before removing
- Untie or remove the head or ear loops and remove the covering by the ties
- Wash it in the washing machine with hot water and completely dry on medium or high heat
- Wash your hands

#### Tips to prevent fogging for glasses-wearing individuals:

- Washing lenses at the beginning of the day, or before donning a covering, with soap and water and drying with a soft cloth can mitigate fog. Dishwashing soap works best.
- Folding down the top of the covering provides a "vent" for air to escape.
- Folding a piece of tissue into a small rectangle and attaching it to the inside of the covering where rests on the bridge of your nose will absorb moisture.

The Frederick County Local Behavioral Health Authority has authorized emergency one time only funding for telehealth start up services for licensed, certified and accredited agencies. This funding will allow the agencies to continue their clinical and recovery operations. The total amount of funding authorized for payment is approximately \$20,000. The LBHA is also working to allocate and distribute various types of PPE to behavioral health providers based on their level of care and services provided. The PPE will assist in the prevention and mitigation of infectious disease

# **Animal Control:**

#### Family Partnership:

Family Partnership of Frederick County is fully engaged with our families and youth as virtual home visiting, GED classes, ESL classes, employment, life skills, mental health services, Responsible Fathers, and Empowering Mothers classes are underway. Our Child Development team is preparing to begin virtual Parent And Child Together (PACT) activities next week and will also be providing individual contact, including providing activities for the children. The teachers are excited to make connection with the families! Nurturing Parenting classes and Health Education should be online soon.
