
Frederick County Agency Updates for May 11, 2020

Frequently Asked Question: What stage of recovery are we in now?

The Maryland Strong Roadmap to Recovery is divided into 3 stages:

- STAGE 1 Low Risk - This is the first stage of the recovery, and involves business, community, religious, and quality of life improvements.
- STAGE 2 Medium Risk - This will likely be a longer stage of the initial recovery, but will also be the stage when a large number of businesses and activities come back online.
- STAGE 3 High Risk - These are the more ambitious and long-term goals.

Right now, we are **STILL IN RESPONSE - PRE-STAGE 1**. Governor Hogan has not announced the beginning of the Low Risk stage. This means that Marylanders should continue to Stay at Home except for essential business and approved outdoor activities.

Marylanders should continue wearing masks or face coverings, and practicing physical distancing. At this point, there are few effective therapeutic treatments for COVID-19 and no vaccine or effective preventive treatments.


Census 2020

Frederick County's self-response rate for the 2020 Census is at 70.1% right now, which is higher than Maryland's overall rate of 62.4%. Way to go Frederick!



However, our 2010 response rate was 75% and we want our 2020 response rate to be even better. Frederick County is #4 in MD for response rate: Harford is 70.7%, and Howard is 72.2%, and Carroll is at 74.5%.
