Frequently Asked Question

Q: When is the best time to get my flu vaccination?

A: Vaccination too early in the season, like in July or August, may lead to less immunity later in the season, especially in older adults. It's best to get your flu vaccination in late September and before the end of October. Your healthcare provider is the best place to get any vaccines, but you can find other locations at vaccinefinder.org.
