Frequently Asked Question: If my employee tested positive for COVID-19, do they need to show me a negative test to come back to work?

- *Answer:* Employees who tested positive for COVID-19 do NOT need a negative test to return to work. Someone with COVID-19 can be released from isolation and return to work when the following conditions have been met:
 - It's been 10 days since their symptoms first appears AND
 - They have not had a fever for 24 hours and are not using any medicine to reduce a fever AND
 - Other symptoms* of COVID-19 are improving

*Symptoms like the loss of taste and smell may persist for weeks or months after recovery and don't need to be gone for someone to end isolation and return to work.

Attention Employers!

Employee tested *positive* for COVID-19?
They do NOT need a negative test to
return to work!

Someone is released from isolation when:

- 10 days since symptoms first appeared AND
- 24 hours with no fever without the use of
fever-reducing medications AND
- Other symptoms of COVID-19 are improving

* * Loss of taste and smell may persist for weeks or months after recovery
and need not delay the end of isolation
