## Maryland State Update

Does Governor Hogan's announcement that Maryland will move out of a state of emergency on July 1 mean that people do not need to wear masks on public buses and trains?

Answer: There is a [federal masking order](#) in place for public transit, so you are still required to wear a mask when riding on a bus or train.

## Frequently Asked Questions

**Q: Will the COVID-19 vaccines protect me against the new Delta variant that has shown up in Maryland?**

A: All of the COVID-19 vaccines offer protection from the emerging variants, but studies are ongoing to determine the best ways to maintain protection against COVID-19 illness. For more information, see the latest from the CDC on [New Variants of the Virus that Causes COVID-19](#).

**Q: Do fully vaccinated people need to get tested if exposed to COVID-19?**

A: While the risk of a fully vaccinated person getting COVID-19 is low, if experiencing [COVID-19 symptoms](#), the individual should be evaluated by their [healthcare provider who will determine if testing is needed](#). Most fully vaccinated people with no COVID-19 symptoms do not need to be tested following exposure to COVID-19 according to the latest guidance from the CDC.

**Q: I'm traveling soon. How can I get tested to show proof that I don't have COVID-19?**

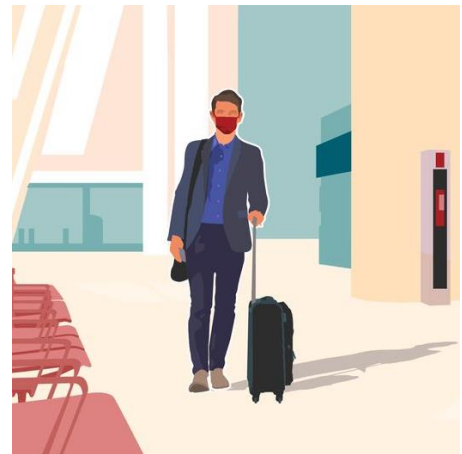
A: Testing is available daily for FREE in Frederick County in the following locations:

**Frederick Vaccination Update**

All Marylanders 12 and older are eligible to get a COVID-19 vaccination. **Please note that only Pfizer is authorized for people 12-17 years old. Children must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.**
