Residents Turn Out to Turn In Unwanted Medications and Sharps

FREDERICK, MD — On Saturday, October 28, the Frederick County Health Department partnered with the Frederick Police Department, Maryland State Police and the Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) to host a drug and sharp take back day as part of “National Prescription Drug Take-Back Day.” Between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m., 105 residents turned in over 150 pounds of unwanted or expired medication and 5,934 sharps at two collection sites.

“We are incredibly grateful to our community and partners who came out on a beautiful fall day and gave part of their Saturday to make this event a success,” said Nate Smith, Opioid Misuse Prevention Program Coordinator. “A huge thanks to the Frederick Police Department, Maryland State Police and the DEA for helping to staff the event, and most of all, we thank our Frederick community for turning out in full force to dispose of medications and syringes safely, which helps keeps our community safe.”
